PROGRAMS & SERVICES

IN-HOME CARE & CAREGIVER SERVICES

Most of us hope to remain independent and age in our own homes. Quality in-home care and caregiver support can make the difference in helping someone to age in place and avoid unnecessary institutionalization. We offer dependable, high quality in-home care attendant services for all income levels, provided on a sliding fee scale.

GERIATRIC CONSULTATION & COUNSELING

As the saying goes: *Aging is the Most Unexpected Thing of All*. Benefits, in-home care, fall prevention, financial considerations, tough conversations, health crisis - it can be difficult to figure out where to begin. We provide individualized consultation and coordination of services and benefits to seniors and their families, in addition to critical emotional support for both seniors and caregivers.

MONEY MANAGEMENT

What happens as age or illness reduces our capacity to manage finances? In addition to possible financial troubles, many become vulnerable to theft, fraud and financial exploitation. By providing assistance with benefits, bill paying and budgeting, we help prevent financial abuse and neglect and preserve independence.

GUARDIANSHIP SERVICES

Some of the most vulnerable people in our community are seniors and adults with disabilities who can no longer care for themselves, but have no family to assist them. Many either have been or are at risk for being abused, exploited or defrauded. Our Guardianship Services staff provide the highest possible quality of life for hundreds of individuals who have been court-appointed as wards of Family Eldercare.

LYONS GARDENS SENIOR HOUSING COMMUNITY

Family Eldercare opened Lyons Gardens in October 2004. This beautiful 54 unit community is an award winning model for affordable, independent senior living.

LIFETIME CONNECTIONS WITHOUT WALLS

Isolation, Ioneliness and depression are significant challenges for home-bound seniors. Lifetime Connections Without Walls is a phone socialization program that helps seniors share, care and learn from the comfort of their own home.

SERVICE COORDINATION & AGING IN PLACE INITIATIVE

This innovative program strives to allow seniors to "age in place" by leveraging and facilitating resources to increase overall health and connections to surrounding community. Family Eldercare is one of twelve federal demonstration sites in the nation for the Aging In Place Initiative.

SUMMER FAN DRIVE

This iconic annual event raises thousands of fans, funds and air conditioners for low income seniors, people with disabilities and families. This program also allows us to connect with thousands of vulnerable seniors to determine if they need additional support or intervention services.

VOLUNTEER SERVICES

Family Eldercare's volunteers are an essential part of our mission. There are a wide variety of volunteer opportunities available including direct service, administrative, Fan Drive and more. In 2011, 639 volunteers provided over 14,000 hours of time.

HOLIDAY GIVING DRIVE

Many of the seniors and adults with disabilities we serves at Family Eldercare have little or no family support. Often they spend the holidays alone and receive no gifts. The Holiday Giving Drive brought cheer to over 400 Family Eldercare clients in 2011.




