Message From Our CEO

Our Vision for 2026

Is to prioritize sustainability, innovation, and strategic investment in core services that help older neighbors age with dignity and stability in a community that cares about them.



1. Sustainability. The social service arena is going through challenging times. Ensuring that Family Eldercare stays open and equipped to continue serving the community is my number one priority. We are committed to our service initiatives and are actively seeking alternative funding sources to continue core services impacted by federal and local funding cuts.

2. Innovation. We are actively seeking creative, innovative, and entrepreneurial solutions not only to increase our financial capabilities, but also to apply these principles to service delivery. For example, our volunteer program will strategically place volunteers in program areas where they can expand or enhance services where needed most. One big initiative is to train recurring volunteers to manage the fan drive office, allowing staff more time to focus on other priorities.

3. Core Services. Housing, financial stability, and well-being services remain our cornerstones. Older adults are now one of the fastest-growing groups becoming homeless in Central Texas, and the need has never been greater. This year will witness the construction of Iris Gardens- our third housing complex-- which is projected to welcome its first residents in late 2027. This year, we also aim to build on the success of our employment initiative which supports formerly homeless older adults in returning to the workplace. Well-Being services will be enhanced by the addition of Elder Companion volunteers paired with older adults who may be isolated or lack the social support they need.

None of this will be possible without you. Together, we can make sure that our elders are valued, supported, and never left behind.

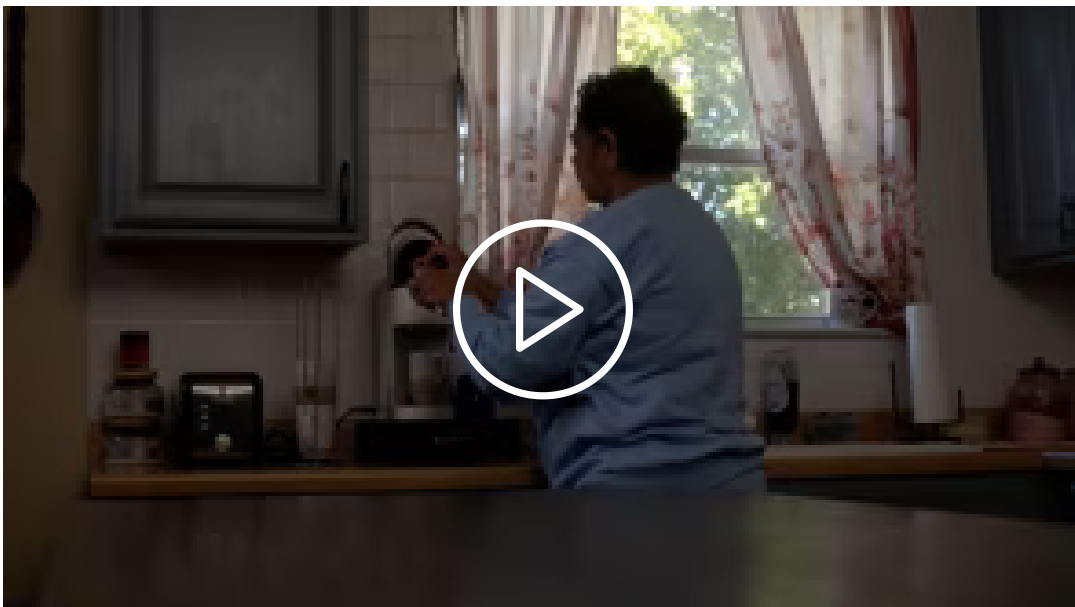
In Case You Missed It

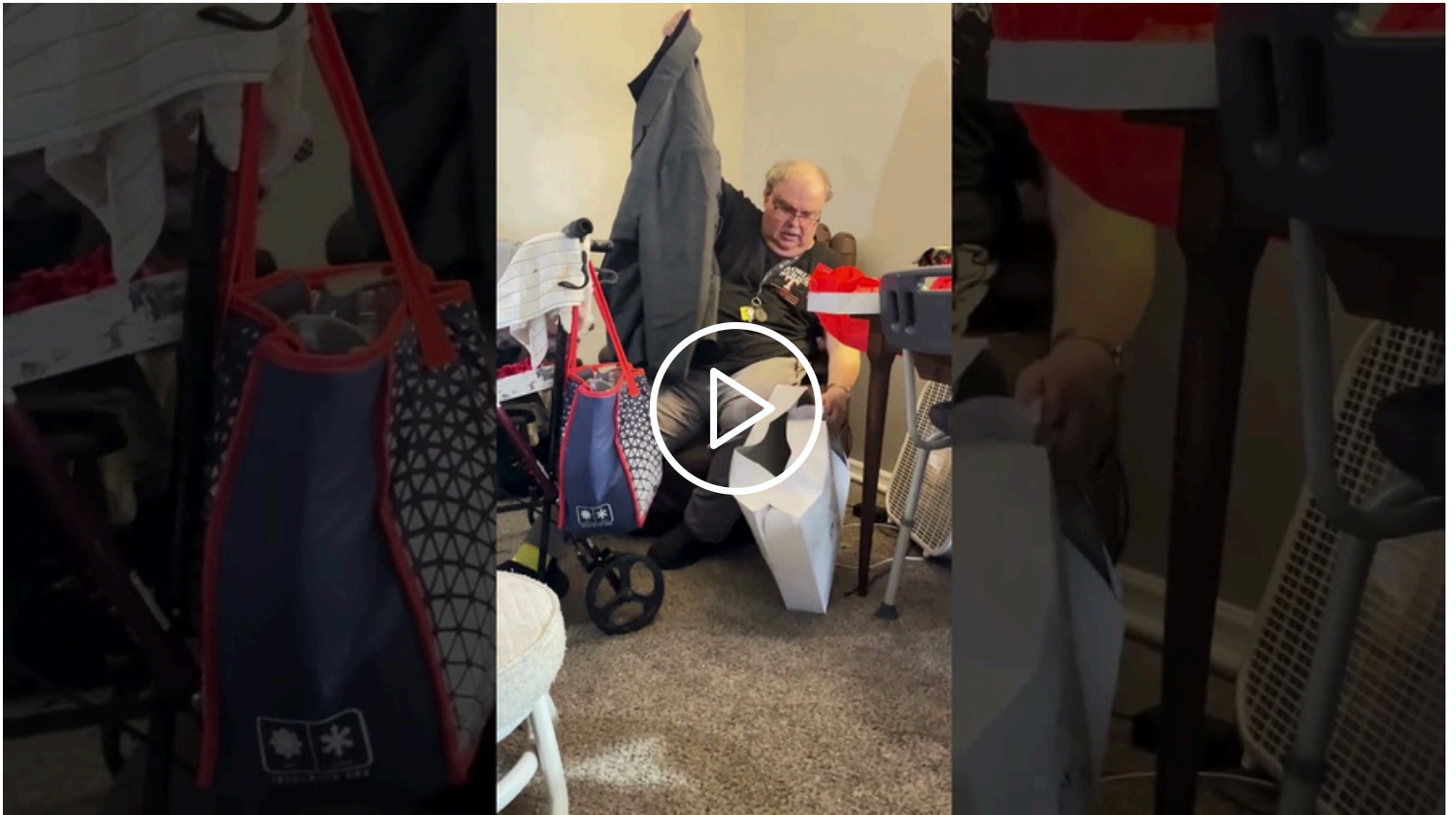
Did You Meet Miss Judy

When RW transitioned out of homelessness with the help of our Rapid Re-Housing (RRH) program, he didn't dream it would happen in time for Christmas. It did!

On Christmas Eve 2025, RW got the keys to his new apartment. The first real home he had in years. And he had a surprise for us. After working with our employment specialist, RW was happy to announce he had accepted a job with the IRS that would pay him a living wage! We're so proud of RW's hard work and for the hard work of our RRH team and employment specialist.



What is Rapid Re-Housing?

It's a critical, evidence-based intervention that rapidly transitions individuals from homelessness into permanent housing while providing an array of services tailored to support the individual's success and housing stability.

Why is it important?

Older adults are one of the fastest growing groups becoming homeless in Central Texas. Rapid Re-Housing is a cost-effective solution for homelessness that is good for long-term stability, health, and frees up emergency and crisis services in the community.
